# Spirit of the 60's

Our Vice-Chairman, John Edwards represented The Yeovil Freewheelers on the Yamaha 9GT TRACER in support of the Westland Classic Motorcycle Club, as a Marshall to recognise the significant sums of money raised by them on the day and in previous years, in the region of 40K in total.

It also provided a Yeovil Freewheelers recruitment platform for the 100 or so attendees (Marshalls and Classic bike riders).

The ride is estimated to have raised more than £1000 on the day.

Other Yeovil Freewheeler Blood Bikers were amongst the Marshalls on their own bikes and also taking part notably was our very own Tony Haywood. The spirit of the 60's run started at Yeovil Rugby Club via Sparkford and Castle Cary to the Helicopter Museum at Weston Super Mare and then returned via Glastonbury.

Our blood bike was in a prominent position at the entrance to the museum whilst there and parked next to the gazebo back at the rugby club. It was also parked very proudly besides Alex Arthur, the event organiser, when he presented the prizes.

#### HERE'S THE STATS!

In April we made 207 deliveries, 105 of which were for various hospitals, 1 was for medical centre, 17 were for care homes, 7 were for private laboratories and 77 were to private addresses. We did 4 CAT-1 tasks and 203 CAT- 2 tasks 41 riders signed up for duty in April and were deployed 89 times.

The Blood Bikes did a total of 10,532 miles and our Dacia Duster did 496 miles, which is amazing. Well done to all those that gave up their own personal time to volunteer.





# IN THE SPOTLIGHT



Here at Yeovil Freewheelers we recognise the committment of each of our members and value their generosity of time and knowledge, so each month we shall be spotlighting one of our members to give an insight into what being a member of The Yeovil Freewheelers is like. This month the spotlight is on one of our riders, Dom White. This is what he said about his time with us.

About 20 plus years ago I spotted a blood bike coming out of Dorchester and thought, as I love motorcycling so much that would be a good job. I didn't realise as many don't that it was voluntary. After chatting with a blood bike member on our stall at the Yeovil steam show some years ago I decided to take my advanced motorcycle licence. I signed up with the Rospa group and was mentored by Ian Piper.

I passed in June 2020 and applied for the Yeovil Freewheelers straight after that. After passing my blues and 2s assessment in September 2020, I was passed operational and carried out my first duty on 14th October that year. I only carried out one Cat 1 on blues before they got taken from us but have done many time sensitive deliveries since. I have clocked up over 100 duties and also managed to fit in many adhoc tasks.

When I first started riding, covid was in full swing and I enjoyed signing up for the evening covid run from YDH to the HUB in Taunton at 20.00hrs and 22.00hrs, picking up from other hospitals on route. It was a guaranteed 160+ mile round trip.



I have ridden in every type of weather at all times of the day and night but also enjoy bucket shaking at fundraising events and chatting to the public(even if they want to or not). I once organised a bucket shake outside Tesco Dorchester just before Christmas and backed with a merry bunch of blood bike volunteers we apparently broke the record of collecting. I think we collected over £1200 in 6 hours.



I have to thank the group for the experience of passing my masters last year. It was paid for by our charity and after obtaining my iAM (with a first may I add) I went straight in to the master training.

I very much enjoy riding for the group and promoting safe motorcycling alongside. Most of all knowing that I'm helping someone that's having a bad day in hospital and hopefully making a difference.


